Your Decision for Christ

When a person is truly saved, he will be hungry to know more about the Word of God. This will only be a beginning. You will find that your church will help you understand the Word of God better as you participate in the Sunday School and worship services.

How to Grow as a Christian

As a result of receiving Christ as Savior and Lord, you have experienced a new birth and begun a new life (John 1:12-14, II Corinthians 5:17). Your physical life did not begin as a full-grown adult, and neither will your spiritual life. When a person is first saved, he is a spiritual infant (I Peter 2:2). The following suggestions should help you grow into a mature Christian.

BIBLE STUDY

Food is essential to a person's physical strength and growth. In like manner, the Word of God is the spiritual food that gives us spiritual strength and growth.

"So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God." (Romans 10:17).

"But without faith it is impossible to please Him...." (Hebrews 11:6)

(Answering the questions in this booklet will encourage you in Bible study.)

PRAYER

Jesus said. "... men ought always to pray, and not to faint" (Luke 18:1).

If you pray, you won't faint, crumble, or give up. Your joy is dependent upon your praying.

"Hitherto have you asked nothing in my name: ask, and you shall receive, that your joy may be full." (John 16:24)

Prayer is talking to God and letting Him talk to you. If we love Him, we will find time to pray. Plan to have a daily prayer time when you can be alone with God, read your Bible, and pray.

(Answering the questions in this booklet will encourage you in your prayer life.)

FAITHFUL CHURCH ATTENDANCE

You need the church just as much as a baby needs parents and fellowship in the home. You need the help found in meeting together with your Christian family. When you surrendered to Jesus as Lord and Savior, you joined the army of Christ. No soldier can be as effective alone as with other soldiers.

"Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another; and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching." (Hebrews 10:25)

(Answering the questions in this booklet will help you see the importance of the local church.)

WITNESSING

Witnessing is sharing what you have experienced. Since you have received Christ, you can tell others how you came to know Christ, and how it affected your life. A few choice Scriptures would aid you in pointing others to Christ. Your job is to witness, not to argue or to win. A person with an experience is never at the mercy of a person with an argument.

Lesson 1

Christ Indwelling Your Life

When you invited the Lord Jesus into your life, He actually and literally came to live in you. Christianity is LIFE -- the life of Christ coming into you at the moment you are born again, and then living through your body each moment of each day. It is not imitating Christ; it is the indwelling of Christ. It is not trying to live like Christ; it is trusting Christ to live in and through you.

Paul said, ". . . *Christ liveth in me; . . .*" (*Galatians 2:20*); and ". . . *Christ in you, the hope of glory*" (*Colossians 1:27*). He also said, "*What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own: For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's.*" (*Corinthians 6:19,20*), and "*Jesus Christ is in you . . .*" (*II Corinthians 13:5*).

God's Word conclusively testifies that when you are BORN AGAIN, the Lord Jesus, as the Holy Spirit, actually comes to live in your body.

Failure to realize that Christ lives in you will result in discouragement and defeat. If you think of Christ simply being near you, rather than living in you, your constant efforts will be to get closer to Him, or to get Him closer to you. However, the truth is that Christ lives in you! Know this! Believe this! Experience this!

He is more than a helper to assist you; more than a teacher to instruct you; and more than a friend to encourage you. He does more than give you strength; He is your strength. He is your life.

". . . Christ, who is our life . . ." (*Colossians 3:4*). His life replaces your life.

As Paul said, *". . . I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me"* (*Galatians 2:20*).

As Jesus said, *". . . without me you can do nothing."* (*John 15:5*).

This lesson has been prepared to help you realize that CHRIST LIVES IN YOU. Memorize Galatians 2:20 to remind you of this great fact.

"I am crucified with Christ; nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me." (*Galatians 2:20*).

Lesson 2

The Church Strengthening Your Life

A church is a group of baptized believers voluntarily joining together for instruction, fellowship, worship, and service.

Jesus Christ personally established the church while He was here on the earth to unite Christians together as a spiritual family (Matthew 16:18). Just as you are physically born into an earthly family, Jesus said you must be spiritually born into God's family (John 3:3).

God has placed men in families for their care, protection, fellowship and development. You need the church for all the reasons you need a family and many more.

It is through the church that you are to be fed the "*milk of the Word*" (1 Peter 2:2).

God said, "*And I will give you pastors according to mine heart, which shall feed you with knowledge and understanding*" (Jeremiah 3:15).

It is through the church that you are to give your tithes and offerings.

God's Word says, "*Upon the first day of the week let everyone of you lay by him in store, as God has prospered him...*" (1 Corinthians 16:2).

Jesus said, "*It is more blessed to give than to receive*" (Acts 20:35). He denounced selfishness as one of the gravest of all sins. He said, "*Take heed, and beware of covetousness; for a man's life consisteth not in the abundance of things which he possesseth*" (Luke 12:15).

Selfishness destroys life. It kept a rich man from becoming a believer (Mark 10:17-22). It can keep you from becoming a strong and useful Christian.

A right attitude toward your total life will mean the difference between a life of joyful victory and a life of frustrating defeat.

This lesson is to help you learn about your church and your responsibilities within it. Begin now to memorize Hebrews 10:25 to remind you to be faithful in attending and supporting your church.

Lesson 3

Victory In Your Life

No doubt you have already experienced some of the trails and temptations, the discouragements and defeats, that come to every Christian.

You may have even asked yourself, "Is it possible for me to overcome the power of sin and temptation still in my life? Is it possible to overcome temper, irritability, pride, jealousy, gossip, worry, anger, hate, lust? Is any such hope of victory taught in the Bible?"

A life of victory is not only possible, but also promised.

God's Word says, ". . . *this is the victory which overcometh the world, even our faith*" (I John 5:4).

To experience this abundant life involves full surrender to and total dependence upon Christ.

It is not a life without temptation and difficulties. It is a life in which Jesus Himself is your strength, joy, ambition, wisdom--everything. Jesus came that He might destroy the power of Satan over you (I John 3:8).

As John said, ". . . *as HE IS, so ARE WE in this world*" (I John 4:17).

He is victorious, and yes, you are victorious if you depend upon Him.

This lesson has been prepared to guide you in knowing how to surrender and trust, to let go and let God perform in you what He has promised (Luke 1:45). Memorize I John 5:4 as a reminder of how to experience **VICTORY IN YOUR LIFE**.

Lesson 4

Prayer Enriching Your Life

Christ's life was filled with prayer.

"And in the morning long before daylight, He got up and went out to a deserted place, and there He prayed" (Mark 1:35).

If you are to grow into His likeness, you also need to spend time with Him in daily prayer.

Jesus said, ". . . men ought always to pray, and not to faint" (Luke 18:1).

He indicated that if you do not pray, you will faint. Without prayer you will be easily defeated by the temptations of the enemy.

God assures you that in answer to prayer He will take care of your every need.

Jesus said, "*Hitherto have you asked nothing in my name; ask, and you shall receive, that your joy may be full*" (John 16:24).

Paul said, "*He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?*" (Romans 8:32).

Your Lord promises to answer prayer, but there are certain conditions.

"If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, you shall ask what you will, and it shall be given unto you" (John 15:7).

To "abide" means to "constantly live." In other words, if you live in constant fellowship with Christ, and in Daily obedience to His Word, then you can ask what you will and it shall be done.

The first prayer may be difficult. The words may come slowly, but you must keep praying. Even the disciples had to learn to pray.

They went to Jesus and said, "*Lord, teach us to pray . . .*" (Luke 11:1).

Lesson 5

God's Word In Your Life

You are to search for God's truth as you would for a HIDDEN TREASURE (Proverbs 2:4).

David said, *"Therefore I love thy commandments above gold; yea above fine gold"* (Psalm 119:127).

Ignorance of the truth of God means ignorance of Jesus.

Jesus said, *"Search the scriptures . . . they . . . testify of me"* (John 5:39).

This precious treasure of truth is your spiritual food, which is so necessary if you are to grow and develop into a strong and useful Christian.

David loved God's Word - *"How sweet are they words unto my taste! Yea, sweeter than honey to my mouth!"* (Psalm 119:103).

Job esteemed the words of God's mouth more than his necessary food (Job 23:12).

God's Word is also a spiritual light that guides your daily walk in Christ.

David said, *"Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path"* (Psalm 119:105).

When Jesus was tempted He met each temptation with God's Word (Matthew 4:3-11). It is also your spiritual weapon of defense against Satan's attacks.

Faith comes from knowing the truth of God (Romans 10:17); and *"without faith it is impossible to please Him"* (Hebrews 11:6).

Jesus said, *"If you live in accordance with what I teach, you are really my disciples, and you will know the truth and the truth will set you free."* (John 8:31,32 Williams)

How wonderful to be free from the power of sin!

Lesson 6

Witnessing - Sharing Your Life

Our Lord's last spoken words on this earth were, "...*you shall be witnesses unto me.*" (*Acts 1:8*).

What is a "witness"? A witness tells what he has seen and heard, what he has experienced. Christ has not asked you to be a lawyer who argues, or a salesman who sells, but a witness who shares.

Personal witnessing is the only way this world will ever know about our precious Lord. Many unsaved will never be saved unless someone goes into their homes and shares Christ with them.

It was said of the Christians in Rome that their faith was "*spoken of throughout the whole world*" (*Romans 1:8*); and of the Thessalonians, "...*the Word of the Lord sounded forth from you...everywhere.*" (*I Thessalonians 1:8*).

These men and women had been with Jesus and the world took notice of the great difference it made. They turned the world upside down or right side up (*Acts 4:13*). Do your friends take notice that you have been with Jesus?

Jesus said, "*Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men.*" (*Matthew 4:19*).

Christ's command is to follow Him in an obedient life. As you do, He promises to make you a fisher of men.

You witness by what you do as well as what you say. At home, at work, or school, there should be something about you that is different -- kindness, love, patience, honesty, consideration, sincerity, a cooperative spirit. Tell your friends and neighbors that Christ makes your life different.

"*And He saith unto them, Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men.*" (*Matthew 4:19*)

This is the last lesson - last, but not least!

Finish it, and you will have finished the whole study.

This is one of the most important lessons of all!
